

JCU Open eBooks project review process and rubric

Why evaluate potential projects?

Projects are evaluated to balance project alignment against **JCU objectives** and the **availability of Library staff** to support project delivery.

Projects that support JCU **learning and teaching** are a primary focus for JCU Open eBooks and will be prioritised. Projects that support the delivery of JCU **research** or JCU's connection to **place and community** will also be considered, though these projects may be supported at a slower pace or require greater self-sufficiency by project authors. Please note this platform is not intended for publication of original research.

Every project brings its own unique strengths and challenges. Projects with additional resourcing and/or a self-sufficient author team may be onboarded more quickly, however we are committed to ensuring equitable opportunities for all. All prospective authors are encouraged to reach out and <u>discuss project</u> needs with us, so we can explore project fit and how best to support you.

The process

Once a JCU Open eBook Expressions of Interest (EOIs) has been submitted it will be reviewed by JCU Library against this review rubric. All applicants will be notified of the outcome of their submission as soon as possible.

- Learning and teaching focused projects that score highly will be provisionally accepted, with applicants potentially invited to engage in further discussions. Prior to commencement, successful applicants will be required to sign a memorandum of understanding with JCU Library.
- Research or place and community projects that score highly will be seriously considered by JCU
 Library. Discussions will be held between Library staff and the project team to develop a shared
 understanding of how the project could progress.
- Projects that achieve a mid-level rating may be asked to enhance or clarify the project plan.
 Discussions will be held between Library staff and the project team to develop a shared understanding of how the project could progress.
- Low scoring projects will be provided with feedback and invited to resubmit with a reworked project proposal.
- The rubric contains some criteria that may determine that a project is ineligible to proceed at this time. These criteria relate to:
 - OER duplication within Australasia (JCU Open eBooks prioritises OER projects that will contribute new and unique content to the growing Australasian OER catalogue.)
 - JCU lead author status
 - The project's lack of connection to current <u>JCU corporate strategy</u> and/or <u>policy</u>.
- Please note that Library EOI decisions will not be based solely on rubric scores. The rubric is intended as a tool to extract useful insights about each project and as a support to Library decision-making. JCU Library will aim to hold well-rounded discussions about each proposal, taking into account additional factors as may be relevant.
